Jeremy McLeod
Breathe Architecture

Jeremy is the founding Director of Breathe Architecture, a team of dedicated Architects that have built a reputation for delivering high quality design and sustainable Architecture for all scale projects. Breathe Architecture has been focusing on sustainable urbanisation and in particular have been investigating how to deliver more affordable urban housing to Melbournians.

Breathe were the instigators of The Commons housing project in Brunswick and now are collaborating with other Melbourne Architects to deliver the Nightingale Model. Nightingale is intended to be an open source housing model led by Architects.

Jeremy believes that architects, through collaboration, can drive real positive change in this city we call home.

Vin Varavarn
Vin Varavarn Architect

Varudh was born in Bangkok Thailand. He received his AA Diploma/ RIBA from the Architectural Association School of Architecture (AA), London. After graduated, Varudh worked in London for several years before returning to Bangkok and established his own practice 'Vin Varavarn Architects (VVA)' in 2005.

Varudh believes in the simplicity of architecture, the value of local materials and the appropriation of craftsmanship. Together with his practice, Varudh has been invited as visiting lecturer for many universities and organizations both in Thailand and abroad. From his recent project, Baan Huay Sarn Yaw - Post Disaster School, Varudh has been selected as the 2nd Asian architect to receive the winner prize from 8th International Biennial Barbara Cappochin Prize of Architecture. This year, Varudh has been appointed as the curator for Thailand Pavilion of 16th Venice Architecture Biennale, and also has been nominated for the RIBA International Prize of Architecture 2018.

Dr Eleena Jamil
Eleena Jamil Architect

Dr Eleena Jamil is the principal of Eleena Jamil Architect, an architectural practice based in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia. Eleena trained at the Welsh School of Architecture in Cardiff, United Kingdom where she obtained her architectural degrees. She later joined the teaching faculty at the Welsh School as a teaching assistant while completing her MPhil and PhD postgraduate research. Eleena Jamil Architect was set up in 2005 and has since been growing steadily with an expanding portfolio of work that has won international accolades.

Working within the context of South-east Asia, her work has been founded on research into specific social and climatic imperatives of each brief within a broader cultural framework. Projects developed within Eleena Jamil Architect have been widely published in international press and have been shortlisted for awards such as the World Architecture Festival Award, the Italian Plan Award, the LEAF Award and the American Architecture Prize.

Lim In Chong (Inch)
Inchscape

Lim In Chong (Inch) is reputed for his extensive tropical plant knowledge, innovative ideas and intuitive understanding of space relations and cultural art forms. Inch's interests lie in renewable energy and sustainability, and his design works strive to reintroduce flora and fauna to once lost habitats. He is the founder and managing director of Inchscape, the Malayan Nature Society (Johore Branch) past chairman, and Landscape Advisor to Mandai Park Development Pte Ltd and the Penang Government.

With over 30 years of landscape design experience, his works are featured locally and internationally throughout Asia, the UK and the USA. Inch's wide-ranging design work encompasses public, private and show gardens, housing and hospitality developments, theme parks and a bear sanctuary. His notable projects include 'Langkah Suka', 'Tropical Spice Garden' and 'The Womb'.

Ling Hao
Ling Hao Architect

Ling Hao was born in 1968 in Sarawak. He graduated from the University of New South Wales. After finishing his studies he worked with Tangguanbee Architects and went on to establish LingHao Architects in 2000 in Singapore. Since then he has steadily amassed a body of works which has great individuality and character, eschewing the conventional glossy tropical-modern aesthetic that is prevalent in South-East Asia. Ling Hao's work is more thoughtful, soulful and sometimes rustic.

For his strong-minded pursuit of an individualistic architecture, Ling Hao was awarded the Singapore Presidents Design Award in 2013 and 2014. He has also exhibited at Toto Gallery MA 30th Anniversary Exhibition in Tokyo in 2015. He was Visiting Associate Professor at Singapore University of Technology and Design in 2015 and 2017.
