

All four Pertubuhan Akitek Malaysia (PAM) Chapters have their own centres now that the PAM Sarawak Chapter's (PAMSC) new centre is officially opened.

"The idea of procuring centres for all Chapters of PAM was first mooted by the PAM Education Fund (PEF) Board way back in 1997 to ensure that each Chapter has its own permanent Secretariat and identity to elevate the image of the architectural profession as well as to better serve members' interest in the respective Chapters," said National PAM President Ar Paul Lai Chuwhen officiating at the opening of PAMSC centre.

He said in line with PAM objectives and strategies, the Council is committed to establishing closer ties with Chapters and its members. There were many familiar faces present including several Council Members and PFF Board Members present to celebrate the occasion.

"I am confident that this Chapter and members will play an increasingly important



role in complementing the PAM Council 's effort in achieving its objectives. The Council is committed to allocate resources through the Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Committee to assist in providing CPD programmes and speakers to upgrade the core competency, skills and knowledge of members so that together we as a profession can be better prepared to be more competitive in meeting the challenges and apportunities of globalisation and liberalisation," Chu added.

In his opening remarks, PAMSC chairman Hubert Kueh Peng Yaw said since PAMSC's formation in 1976, it has been like a homeless child, squatting in the offices of various benevolent architects until 2001 when it found a nest to roost in the form of a cubicle at the Ultimate Professional Centre.

"We were more comfortable there but not for long as the numerous activities held by the Chapter meant we have outgrown our nest and required a permanent centre to service our members effectively. This historic moment has arrived and I am indeed very proud and happy to be standing here today at our new Centre. Finally, this homeless child has found home," Kueh added.

Over 20,000 visited BTS 2005
