

# MENTORING by PAMSC

This is a continuation of the interview questions and answers from the mentoring session; one of the interview questions on architectural styles has been expanded into an article by Ar. Ng Chee Wee.

CW: Chee Wee , M: Min

- SPM: How much approximately should I budget for an architectural education, from foundation to masters, inclusive of living expenses, if I were to study in a Sarawakian university?
- M: Government universities are very affordable, and there are scholarship schemes to help those who are eligible. 20K v 60K

Private university fees are 3 to 4 times higher.

- 2. Do we always need a concept for a building design? Can we not start with the functional and the practical as a starting point for s project?
- CW: For architecture the "Concept" is the starting point for every design. It is the main driving force behind the ideas. Being Functional and Practical is also a concept. Some of the greatest architects i.e. Mies Van Der Rohe and Walter Gropius use Function as their key starting point.

For Mies and Gropius - Function is not just about the usage of the building. It goes into how we perceive, experience and engage with buildings. They look into how the structure is expressed, how the form and design is stripped back to just the essential elements, and this is Mies' concept of "Less is More"

A Concept is what gives a design depth and meaning. Many architects struggle for days, weeks and months to come up with a great concept, and polish it until it is the best it can be. And these are the designs that stand out from the rest.

M: There is a third element which is one of 'beauty' or 'delight'. I prefer the word delight better to explain that special something that make the observer turn her head to take a second look, and reach out to touch it or to say to herself 'someone sat down for a long time and worked out the solution' or maybe to say to herself 'how I wish I thought of that first'. We usually think of structure and services as very functional and practical things; in these 4 examples, they are used to express the element of delight. The skeleton and the nervous system of the building is expressed as part of the architecture. And they all involve Peter Rice, who was an engineer. Engineers we normally associate them with providing practicality and function - in these cases - he provided the delight.

Sometimes it is not a physical thing, but the absence of one like the hole in the roof that becomes an air well or a light well. (Its Chinese name carries more meaning as  $\mathcal{K}$  means sky well, allowing in a bit of the sky. (Image 162)


## 3. How do you know when to stop developing your design?

- M: This question was posed by a student, so this is the answer in relation to university work. It's about time management and I tell students about the four steps:
  - Understand the brief/ frame the problem statement.
  - 2. Research broadly for possible solutions.
  - Test your solutions with your lectures and your peers at the crits. And decide on one as early as possible).
  - Draw up the scheme you decided on with all the supporting presentation material, models, perspectives, etc.

At university, you don't usually get a chance to build your work so your design process stops when you submit your scheme. Although sometimes, when you get to build your chair or sculpture design, you face the same problems we do as practitioners, you make changes to the design to improve it: its proportions or materials or sometimes you make technical changes such as repositioning supports or connection details.

This happens in real life where the design process can continue until the completion of the project. (Image 3-5)

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- 4. How do we as employees know when it is time to move on, what are the ways to keep track as we are busy pursuing our career?
- M: Part of one's Continual Professional Development is to have milestones:
  - Part 3 registration,
  - Managing and completing a project,
  - Learning specific skills
  - Be made a partner


Share these milestones with your boss, ask for his help to achieve them. Give yourself and your boss a reasonable time frame. If he does not keep his end of the agreement, start looking around for another job. That's why it is important to keep an up-to-date cv and portfolio of your work.

Broaden your network of peers by joining PAM.

- 5. As a Part 1 graduate my daily work is not related to my interest which involves community projects. While I know I have much to learn compared to my supervisors - I am wondering how I can stay motivated at work while I prepare to do my Part 2.
- M: Talk to your supervisors, better still speak to the boss and tell him your plans, and find out what his plans are for you as well.

Give yourself a time frame, and if you don't feel that your skills are not properly used after that time, talk to the boss again, after which look for another place if there is no change.

And don't see this as time wasted - it is part of your growing process.


